G. Non-price measures to reduce the demand for tobacco

Each Party shall, to the extent possible within the means at its disposal and its capabilities, adopt legislative, executive and administrative measures, and cooperate with other Parties in harmonizing appropriate non-price policies, in order to reduce tobacco consumption and exposure to tobacco smoke. Such measures and policies shall include the following:

1. Each Party shall adopt measures, and cooperate with other Parties in developing non-price policies, in order to reduce tobacco consumption and exposure to tobacco smoke. The measures and policies shall include:

Text proposed by Canada

1. Each Party shall adopt measures and cooperate with other parties in developing appropriate non-price policies, in order to reduce tobacco consumption, prevalence of tobacco use and exposure to tobacco smoke. Such measures and policies shall include the following:

Text proposed by Iran

1. Each Party shall adopt legislative, executive and administrative measures, and cooperate with other Parties in harmonizing appropriate non-price policies, in order to reduce tobacco consumption and exposure to tobacco smoke. Such measures and policies shall include *inter alia* the following:

Each Party shall adopt [legislative, executive and administrative] measures and cooperate with other Parties in an increasing and progressive way with the aim of developing appropriate non-price policies, in order to reduce tobacco consumption and exposure to tobacco smoke. 1. Each party shall adopt legislative, executive and administrative measures, and cooperate with other Parties in adhering to international standards set by WHO on appropriate non-price policies, in order to reduce tobacco consumption and exposure to tobacco smoke. Such measures and policies shall include the following:

Text proposed by South Africa (co-sponsored by Member States of the WHO African Region)

1. Each Party shall adopt legislative, executive and administrative measures, and cooperate with other parties in harmonizing appropriate non-price policies, in order to reduce tobacco consumption and exposure to tobacco smoke. Such measures and policies shall include the following:

Text proposed by Sweden (on behalf of the European Community and its Member States)

1. Each Party shall, to the extent possible within the means at its disposal and its capabilities, adopt legislative, executive, administrative or similar measures, and cooperate with other Parties in developing appropriate non-price policies, including measures to combat illicit traffic, in order to reduce tobacco consumption and exposure to tobacco smoke. G. Non-price measures to reduce the demand for tobacco

(Passive smoking)

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, enclosed public places, and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

Text proposed by Bosnia and Herzegovina

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, enclosed public places, and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children, pregnant women, people with chronic diseases, disabled people and invalids;

Text proposed by Brazil

(new title) (Regulation of indoors tobacco smoking consumption)

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that prohibit indoors tobacco smoking in order to stimulate smokers to quit, non-smokers not to begin and overall to provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, enclosed public places, and public transport, with particular attention to vulnerable groups such as children and pregnant women;

Text proposed by Canada

- (a) implementation of measures that progressively eliminate smoking completely from locations designated by each States Party to protect all non-smokers;

Text proposed by India

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, public places and public transport;

Text proposed by Iran

(a)

(i) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, public places, public gatherings and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

(ii) each Party should report on its activities under this article within two years of the entry into force of this convention using a format agreed.

Text proposed by Japan

(a) implementation of effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, enclosed public places, and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

Text proposed by Kenya

(a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in workplaces, public places, and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

Text proposed by Mexico

(a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in health units and schools, indoor workplaces, enclosed public places, and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

(new title) (*Protection of the non-smoker*)

Text proposed by Norway

(a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, restaurants, bars, cafes and other public places and public transport, with particular attention to special sensitive groups;

Text proposed by Paraguay

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection against exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces and enclosed and crowded public places, with particular emphasis on risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

Text proposed by Peru

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for appropriate protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, enclosed and crowded public places, and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

Text proposed by Rwanda

- (a) implementation by the signatory Parties of effective measures that provide for protection against exposure to tobacco products in workplaces and public places;

Text proposed by Sweden (on behalf of the European Community and its Member States)

(new title) (*Environmental tobacco smoke*)

- (a) implementation of legislation, voluntary agreements or other effective measures at the appropriate governmental or non-governmental level that provide appropriate protection from exposure to environmental tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, enclosed public places, and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

Text proposed by Thailand

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in workplaces, public places, and public transport;

Text proposed by the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, enclosed public places, including sports places, public transport and health organizations with particular attention to special sensitive groups;

Text proposed by the United States of America

- (a) implementation of legislation and other effective measures at the appropriate governmental level that provide for systematic protection from exposure to tobacco smoke in indoor workplaces, enclosed public places, and public transport, with particular attention to special risk groups such as children and pregnant women;

G. *Non-price measures to reduce the demand for tobacco*

(Regulation of contents of tobacco products)

- (b) adoption of standards for the regulation of the contents of tobacco products, including standards for testing and measuring, designing, manufacturing and processing such products, and cooperation in the development and harmonization of such standards under the auspices of the World Health Organization;

Text proposed by Cuba

- (b) adoption of standards for the regulation of the contents of tobacco products, including standards for testing and measuring those products, and cooperation in the development and harmonization of such standards under the auspices of the appropriate international organizations;

Text proposed by Indonesia

- (b) adoption of standards for the regulation of the contents of tobacco products, including standards for testing and measuring, designing, manufacturing and processing of such products, and cooperation in the development and harmonization of such standards in consultation with the World Health Organization, and towards this end, each Party shall ensure that the costs of implementing such measures are fully covered by the tobacco manufacturers;

Text proposed by Israel

- (b) adoption and implementation of minimum standards for the regulation of the contents of tobacco products, including standards for testing and measuring, designing, manufacturing and processing such products, as provided by the World Health Organization and striving to adopt additional national standards;

Text proposed by Norway

- (b) adoption of standards for the regulation of the contents of tobacco products and exposures thereof including standards for testing and measuring, designing, manufacturing and processing such products, and cooperation in the development of such standards under the auspices of the World Health Organization;

Text proposed by Pakistan

(b) adoption of national standards for the regulation of the contents of tobacco products, including standards for testing and measuring, designing, manufacturing and processing, whichever applicable, of such products.

Text proposed by the European Commission (on behalf of the European Community and its Member States)

(b) regulation of the contents of tobacco products, including the testing, measuring, designing, manufacturing and processing of such products, reduction of the levels of harmful components, and cooperation in the development and harmonization of standards under the auspices of the International Standards Organization, integrating the public health criteria identified in this Convention and its protocols;

Text proposed by Thailand

(b) Parties shall take measures to reduce the harm associated with tobacco use by adoption of standards for the regulation of reduced risk and conventional tobacco products, including standards for testing and measuring contents, marketing, designing, manufacturing and processing such products. In collaboration with parties to this agreement, prepare a protocol on tobacco product regulation to define and implement best practice in the setting of such standards;

Text proposed by the United States of America

(b) cooperation under the auspices of the World Health Organization in the development of general model standards or procedures for the regulation of the contents of tobacco products; and establishment of domestic regulatory agencies that are science- and health-based and have enforcement authority.
