## From 12/17/13 Oversight and Government Reform Committee interview with CMS Chief Information Security Officer Teresa Fryer #2

- Q So since December 10th, have you had the daily out briefs with MITRE?
  - A Yes.
  - Q Have you been on the calls?
- A Not today. And not -- I'm trying to remember, not yesterday, but I was since December 10th.
- Q So what issues have they discovered with this round of security testing?
- A I can't in detail give you -- there were two high findings. I can't give you in detail what the two high findings were, but they are in -- they are being remediated.

BY MR.

- Q So you say you can't give us detail because you don't recall the details?
- A Yes, I -- one was just recently discovered, and the other one I can't -- I don't recall the exact details of the finding.
- Q Just to be clear, these are two new high findings that were not previously identified by MITRE or anybody else?
- A One high finding was identified in an incident that was reported in November.
  - Q What can you tell us about that incident?

So that incident was reported and that's when they discovered this vulnerability in the system. However, they shut the module down so this functionality is currently shut down.

Q So one high finding was identified in November, and the other high finding has -- was identified after December 10th?

A No, this -- so just to correct, the high finding was just discovered during this testing last week, but it was related to the incident that was reported in November.

- Q I see. That's one of the high findings?
- A Yes.
- Q And what's the other high finding?

A That one, I guess that I don't know the details of. It was just reported, I believe, yesterday.

Q Okay. So two new high findings. How about so-called moderate findings, or in the terminology in the report, moderate findings? Have there been new moderate findings?

A There have been new moderate findings, but I can't say.

There's only been a few moderate findings, and I can't give you the details of those.

- Q Okay. How about so-called low findings?
- A A couple new low findings.

BY MR.

Q The first high finding that you said was reported in


November, who reported it?

A I can't give -- I mean, I can't answer that because I don't know specifically who reported the incident. We see the incident tickets when they come in, so I know that issue was reported.

Q Was it -- was it reported by someone who had gotten access to another person's application?

A I can't answer that. I can't -- I can't recall exactly who it was reported by.

Q But was that -- correct me -- let me clarify. Was that the high finding that an individual received the application of another individual?



Q Oh, I see. And the second high finding was just discovered yesterday?

A Yes, it was yesterday or -- what is today -- Tuesday.

Q Do you know if these -- were these high findings, do you know how long they were in existence in the system?


A No, I don't know.

Q So it's possible they have been in the system since October 1st?

A Again, I can't speculate. If they would have been discovered in the first -- again, I can't say.

- Q Would they have been within -- were they within the scope of the security testing in the August-September time frame?

  Do you know?
- A I can't recall if it was a piece that was in scope of the first testing.
  - Q Do you know how these high findings are being remediated?
  - A No, I don't. In detail I don't know how they are.
- Q You said that with the first high finding that the module was shut down?
  - A Yes, so that functionality has -- is currently shut down.
  - Q Do you know what functionality that is?
  - A It's the



- Q Are there any other functionalities that have been shut down as a result of security testing that you know of?
  - A I can't -- I can't answer that. I don't know.
  - Q Okay.
