Dear Mr. Secretary:

On December 2, 2015, Tashfeen Malik and her husband, Syed Rizwan Farook, killed fourteen people and wounded twenty-one others in San Bernardino, California in a terror-related mass shooting. Ms. Malik reportedly entered the United States on a K-1, fiancée, visa. ²

To assist the Committee's investigation of Ms. Malik's presence in the United States, we request that the Department of Homeland Security and any relevant component agencies produce all documents referring or relating to Tashfeen Malik, including, but not limited to:

- 1. Enforcement and Removal Operations Executive Summaries;
- 2. all documents referring or relating to Ms. Malik's immigration procedural history, criminal history, and/or immigration history;
- 3. all immigration benefit applications received by the Department or any component agencies;
- 4. all documents referring or relating to detainers filed;
- 5. all notices to appear that have been drafted, issued, or served;
- 6. all documents referring or relating to pending immigration charges; and

7. a full and complete copy of the alien file.

Provide these documents and information as soon as possible, but no later than 5:00 p.m. on December 18, 2015. Please also provide a briefing for Committee staff on the immigration and criminal histories of each of these individuals no later than noon on December 21, 2015.

The Committee on Oversight and Government Reform is the principal oversight committee of the House of Representatives and may at "any time" investigate "any matter" as set forth in House Rule X.

When producing documents to the Committee, please deliver production sets to the Majority staff in Room 2157 of the Rayburn House Office Building and the Minority staff in Room 2471 of the Rayburn House Office Building. The Committee prefers, if possible, to receive all documents in electronic format. An attachment to this letter provides additional information about responding to the Committee's request.
