Dear Mr. Mulvaney:

On April 12, 2018, you appeared before the Senate Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs to discuss the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau's semi-annual report to Congress. During the hearing, you stated the average compensation for the Bureau's 1,600 employees is \$195,000 per year. You also testified there are approximately 370 employees at the CFPB who earn more than \$174,000 per year—the salary for a U.S. Senator. Senator.

In creating the Bureau, Congress authorized a compensation schedule apart from the General Schedule (GS) system, which is used at most federal agencies.⁴ This was done in part to ensure the Bureau could attract qualified individuals who may otherwise be enticed to work at leading financial institutions or law firms. The extent to which salaries at the Bureau depart from government-wide norms, however, raises questions.

To help the Committee determine whether taxpayer dollars are being managed efficiently at the Bureau, please provide the following documents and information:

- 1. An anonymized current list of all CFPB employees, including occupational title, pay band, adjusted base salary (to include locality pay adjustment, if any), and bonus or award received in Fiscal Year 2017, if any; and
- 2. Documents referring or relating to salary guidelines or factors for determining the appropriate salary level for CFPB employees.
