Dear Chair Khan:

The Committee on Oversight and Accountability is investigating the role of the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) in the failure of the merger of Amazon.com, Inc. (Amazon) and U.S.-based iRobot Corporation (iRobot). The proposed \$1.4 billion merger between the two American companies was abandoned after continued "opposition from EU and U.S. antitrust regulators," exacerbated by what industry experts describe as "significant, burdensome changes" to premerger filing requirements under the Hart-Scott-Rodino Act. Similar to the FTC's questionable consultation with foreign officials to block the Illumina-Grail merger, it appears that the FTC worked with the European Commission (EC) to kill the Amazon-iRobot merger. The FTC's anticompetitive actions threaten to harm America's global position in the personal robotics market, while ceding market share of personal robotics to foreign entities such as China, and—as already seen—cost hundreds of Americans their jobs. 4

On August 5, 2022, Amazon and iRobot announced that they "entered into a definitive merger agreement under which Amazon will acquire iRobot." After an initial review of the companies' intended merger, the FTC made a second request for information about the transaction on September 19, 2022. After the FTC announced its investigation, reports emerged indicating that the EC would investigate the merger. On July 6, 2023, the EC announced an "indepth investigation into the proposed acquisition of iRobot by Amazon." On January 18, 2024,

reports showed that the EC advised Amazon that it would block the merger. On January 31, 2024, one of the FTC's Commissioners spoke at an antitrust conference in Brussels and said the FTC had been prepared to block the transaction. 10

On January 29, 2024, Amazon and iRobot agreed to terminate the deal, stating that the merger had "no path to regulatory approval in the European Union." The companies described the failure of the merger as "a loss for consumers, competition, and innovation" that would harm iRobot's ability to "better compete in the global marketplace, particularly against companies, and from countries, that aren't subject to the same regulatory requirements" —specifically, China. The FTC championed the news: "We are pleased that Amazon and iRobot have abandoned their proposed transaction." After the deal was abandoned, iRobot announced that it would cut 31% of its workforce or 350 employees, mostly in the United States. 15

The FTC's actions indicate to American businesses that the FTC will work outside of U.S. antitrust law by using the EC to realize its desired outcomes. EC Executive Vice-President Margarethe Vestager admitted that the EC was "in close contact" with the FTC throughout the investigation. Instead of protecting American interests in the global market, the FTC appears to have actively coordinated with a foreign authority to block a merger which could have saved American jobs and promoted American innovation and standing in a vital market. Amazon CEO Andy Jassy recently called the failure of the merger "a sad story," concluding that regulators, including the FTC, "trust . . . two large Chinese companies with maps of the inside of U.S. consumers' homes more than they do Amazon." China-based Ecovacs Robotics is one of iRobot's main competitors and both companies use technology to map consumers' homes. In the process of the inside of U.S.

- 1. All communications and documents shared between the FTC and European officials regarding the iRobot/Amazon merger;
